Advising Notes

EDN 101 – even if this does not specifically transfer to your chosen institution, it is highly recommended as a career exploration course to help you: 1) decide if an Education major is for you, 2) decide what age children with which you want to work, 3) become familiar with the expectation of an Education major.

EDN 104 – this course is a one-credit course that is taught as an independent study. It should be taken at the same time as, or after, taking EDN 101. It includes 30 hours of observation in a school. The State of Illinois requires at least 100 hours of in-school observation prior to student teaching and these hours will help you reach that number and reduce the number of extra hours you will have to complete after you transfer.

EDN 210 – even if this does not specifically transfer to your chosen institution, it is highly recommended as a skills-building course. Many Colleges of Education do not offer a course like this, but rather “infuse” technology into all the Education major courses. That means you are expected to be able to use the technology without any additional instruction. If you are not comfortable with Excel, merging documents in Word, advanced Power Point, Web 2.0 Social Networking technologies, or basic Webpage Design, this class is for you!

EDN 280 – this class is not only widely transferable, but also meets the State of Illinois requirement that states all Education majors must take at least one course on exceptional children / special needs education.

PSY 201 – don’t forget that this Psychology course is also one of the primary Education courses and is the most transferable of all the Education courses Oakton offers!
