Below is a general overview of WIA eligibility for the Adult and Dislocated Worker Program and should be used as an indicator only. A number of factors are taken into consideration for eligibility. - ▲ Collecting or eligible for Unemployment Insurance and
- ▲ Unlikely to return to prior industry (declining) or occupation (low growth) or
- ▲ Unemployed 26 weeks consecutively without having held any employment or
- ▲ Laid off due to plant closure or substantial layoff

- ▲ Total family income in the last 6 months falls below amount listed in earnings chart. Spouse's earnings are included in calculating total income and children living in the home should also be included in the family size.

- ▲ Receiving cash payments under public assistance program.
- ▲ Receiving food stamps.

- ▲ Displaced Homemaker who has been dependent on the income of another family member, but is no longer supported by that income.
- ▲ Displaced Homemaker who is unemployed or under employed and is experiencing difficulty in obtaining or upgrading employment.
