

OVERVIEW

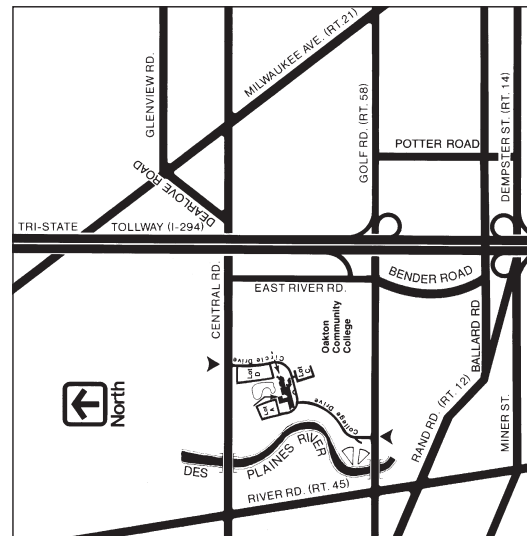

PRESENTERS

Kathy Oriel, MD

Dr. Oriel is a family physician who has cared for trans and non-binary individuals for over 20 years. She partnered with Diverse and Resilient, a queer advocacy organization in Milwaukee, in receipt of over \$1 million to assess community-based peer interventions to reduce health disparities for LGBTQ people in Wisconsin. She is a past president of the Gay and Lesbian Medical Association. She served as the University of Wisconsin's Family Medicine Residency Program director for nine years. She recently left the UW School of Medicine and Public Health to start a small solo family medicine practice: Oriel Medicine in Madison, Wisconsin.

Darla Lannert

Darla Lannert is a Vietnam combat veteran, speaker and educator, as well as a parent of three and grandparent to four. Lannert has spoken at UW Medical School, UW School of Social Work, UW Hospital and Edgewood College. She has played a role in educating Amazon employees, police officers, firefighters, and 911 dispatchers. Darla was a former Trans Health Consultant at OutReach LGBT Center, and board member at PFLAG Sun Prairie, Wisconsin.

Brittyn Calyx

Brittyn Calyx is a certified peer specialist, educator, facilitator, and Wisconsin Army National Guard veteran who lives and works in the Madison area. She is the house manager at Solstice House, a peer-run respite and has worked as a transgender health consultant at OutReach LGBT Community Center. She studied environmental science and anthropology at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee.

Joanne Lee

Joanne Lee is a registered nurse and mother of two children. Her son Skylar, who came out as transgender in 2014, took his life at age 16 due to depression. Lee is an advocate for better treatment of LGBTQ youth. Skylar's death changed Lee's whole life, and she is now an advocate for family acceptance with hopes of saving lives of other transgender people dealing with depression.

OBJECTIVES

- Identify the language and types of questions that are appropriate and respectful when working with trans clients.
- Learn ways to explore population-specific clinical data including what to collect as well as what risk factors to assess—both at time of intake and throughout the provision of services—when working with Trans clients.
- Discover the potential physical, mental and social effects of hormone treatment, including changes in mental health symptoms, interactions with psychotropic medications, shifts in ideal weight ranges and medical needs, and alterations in social relationships.
- Learn clinical strategies from systems-based therapies to multicultural therapies, and for supporting clients who are transitioning or coming into authentic gender expression.
