

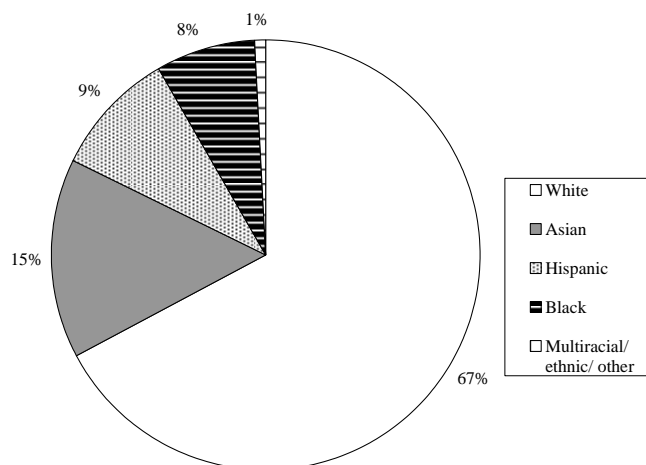
Student Demographic Characteristics: Public School Districts within Oakton’s Area

The following data depict the demographic characteristics of the 69,107 students in the 29 public elementary and high school (K-12) districts within Oakton’s area. Data are from the Fall 2005 school report cards. The five public high school districts (Evanston, Maine, New Trier, Niles and Northfield - Glenbrook) are contiguous with township boundaries. Each K-8 district ordinarily feed into one township high school district.

Fifteen percent of K-12 students are classified as low-income, using this state definition: students come from families receiving public aid; live in institutions for neglected or delinquent children; are supported in foster homes with public funds; or are eligible to receive free or reduced-price lunches.

Seven percent of K-12 students are classified as Limited-English-Proficient (LEP), using this state definition: eligible for transitional bilingual programs.

The pie chart on the right shows the race/ethnic makeup of the 69,107 students. Sixty-seven percent of students are white, 15 percent are Asian, etc.



The table below shows the distribution of each race/ethnic group across the townships. It shows, for example, that 72 percent of K-12 black students in Oakton’s area are in Evanston Township.
