

## ***About Oakton: External Surveys***

This spring the U.S. General Accounting Office is conducting a survey of community colleges and technical schools at the request of the Senate Committee on Health, Education, Labor and Pensions. We thought you might be interested in some Oakton data compiled for the survey. The data give insights into the array of programs offered by Oakton and the number of individuals served. Unless otherwise noted, data are for fall 2002.

Q: How many students were enrolled in Oakton's courses and programs or received training during the fall term of 2002?

A: 23,015. This includes students in credit and non-credit courses.

Q: How many students were enrolled in at least one course eligible for academic transfer?

A: 9813. All of Oakton's college-level courses transfer somewhere, though courses in career programs transfer to fewer institutions or more limited majors.

Q: How many students were enrolled in at least one credit course in a career program?

A: 4166.

Q: How many students were enrolled in at least developmental course (includes Oakton English as a second language courses)?

A: 1938.

Q: How many students were enrolled in at least one basic skills course in each of these areas (courses offered through the Alliance for Lifelong Learning -- ALL)?

A: Adult Basic Education	758
English as a second language	1601
GED high school completion	122

Q: How many trainees participated in any of Oakton's contract training offerings during the 2002-03 academic year (programs offered through the Institute for Business & Professional Development)?

A: 1490.

Q: How many 2002-03 contracts were with each of the following entities:

A: Private businesses	108
Nonprofit organizations	10
Municipalities or other government entities	11
Other entities	1
