

## **October 2022 Leadership Update**

We're now two full months into our fall term, and it's inspiring to see our students gaining confidence as they navigate their classes, build relationships with peers, faculty and staff, and strive toward their goals.

This week, we welcomed nearly 70 students who began Late Start classes – taking their first course at Oakton. Late start (or flexible start) classes allow students to join our community at multiple points throughout the year, giving them an on-ramp to Oakton when it works for them rather than expecting them to conform to a traditional 16-week semester. Please pay special attention to new students who might need assistance navigating our campus for the first time and connect them with resources to ensure they are fully supported.

It's hard to believe, but spring registration will be opening soon. Priority registration is Nov. 14-16, and open registration begins Nov. 17. Remind students that registration will be opening and ask them if they need assistance with the enrollment process. We must work together to support students as they continue their education at Oakton and enable them to fulfill their academic and career goals.

I appreciated the opportunity to engage with some of you during Community Conversations at each campus focused on our new strategic plan. I heard powerful examples of the best of the Oakton Experience in each conversation. Sometimes the smallest gesture can significantly impact a student, fostering a sense of connection and belonging that is critical to student success.

Our strategic goal to strengthen students' Oakton Experience requires that we are intentional about creating these meaningful moments, supporting our students at every step in their journey. I know many of you are stretched thin given the vacancies in many departments and that taking the time to engage in meaningful ways with students might feel like just one more thing to add to an already overflowing plate. I encourage you to reflect on what experiences provide you with life-giving energy and what experiences are depleting. I get energy when I know I helped a student or a colleague, and I hope you will too. Our colleagues who are participating in the Caring Campus Initiative are working to identify specific ways to create those moments together – benefiting students and providing us with the life-affirming energy we all need to engage in our work.

The Oakton Experience is also enhanced by the continued modernization of our spaces as outlined in our Facilities Master Plan. I'm pleased to share that this week, our Board of Trustees approved two architectural firms to begin design and engineering work on our next phase of campus upgrades. Phase one renovations include updating the Des Plaines Campus TenHoeve Center and transforming the Skokie Campus Library into a Learning Commons. I'm confident this continued transformation will create a more welcoming environment for students, promoting collaboration and supporting success.

I look forward to engaging in a shared day of learning with you next Wednesday (Oct. 26) for our fourth annual College-wide Learning Day. This year's Learning Day theme is "Serving Adult Students - An Imperative to Building Just and Thriving Communities." I look forward to deepening our understanding of ways to reduce barriers and provide relevant support for adult students, a strategy outlined in our Strategic Plan. I'm especially excited to join many of you for the keynote address from Jairo McMican, associate director of equity initiatives at Achieving the Dream. Mr. McMican's address, "Serving Adult Learners is an Equity and Strategic Enrollment Imperative," will help us examine our biases toward adult students and strategize ways to help them navigate their educational journeys. Learning Day is designed for you to step away from the demands of your day-to-day routine and experience a shared learning experience with your colleagues, which I hope will provide you with life-affirming energy.

One way we serve adult students is through the Northwestern Prison Education Program. This month, we celebrated the program's second graduating class with a ceremony at Stateville Correctional Center in Joliet. Another 16 incarcerated men earned an associate degree from Oakton on their pathway to earning a bachelor's degree from Northwestern University. As was the case when we celebrated the first cohort of graduates last spring, this event provided a moment of inspiration and a reminder of the importance of creating pathways and access to education for all of our community members.

I'm pleased to welcome two visiting faculty from Joensuu, Finland. They are spending two weeks at Oakton as part of the Illinois Consortium for International Studies and Programs (ICISP) exchange program. Additionally, Oakton hosted 10 international faculty visitors from the Netherlands, Sweden, and Germany last week as part of the "All 4 One International Partnership." Thank you to faculty members Michelle James and Mary Kakenmaster for hosting our Finnish visitors, and Katherine Schuster, Lisa Cherivtch, and Erick Rohn for facilitating the opportunities with our All 4 One partners to exchange ideas with educators, helping to create a more enriching learning environment. Thank you also to this month's long list of lifesavers for the many ways you've gone above and beyond to support students and one another.
