

# The Holocaust and the Concept of Trust in the Southern Zone of France with Adam Yunis

**Jewish Studies Fall 2021 Zoom Webinar | Thursday, October 14 | 11 a.m. - 12:15 p.m.**



The virtual lecture focuses on the Holocaust in South France, examining survival efforts and the social relationship between Jews and non-Jews. Adam Yunis introduces the concept of trust and its centrality to Jewish decision-making throughout the Holocaust. Case studies illustrate the complex power and social dynamics in place during Jewish survival efforts. Present-day Holocaust issues, mainly reparations and ensuring Holocaust survivors live their last years with dignity is also discussed.

Adam Yunis is a candidate for master's degree in public history from Loyola University. He currently works as the Program Support Specialist and Assistant Reparations Coordinator for Holocaust Community Services in Chicago. Yunis graduated from the University of Denver in 2017, majoring in International Studies and French language.
